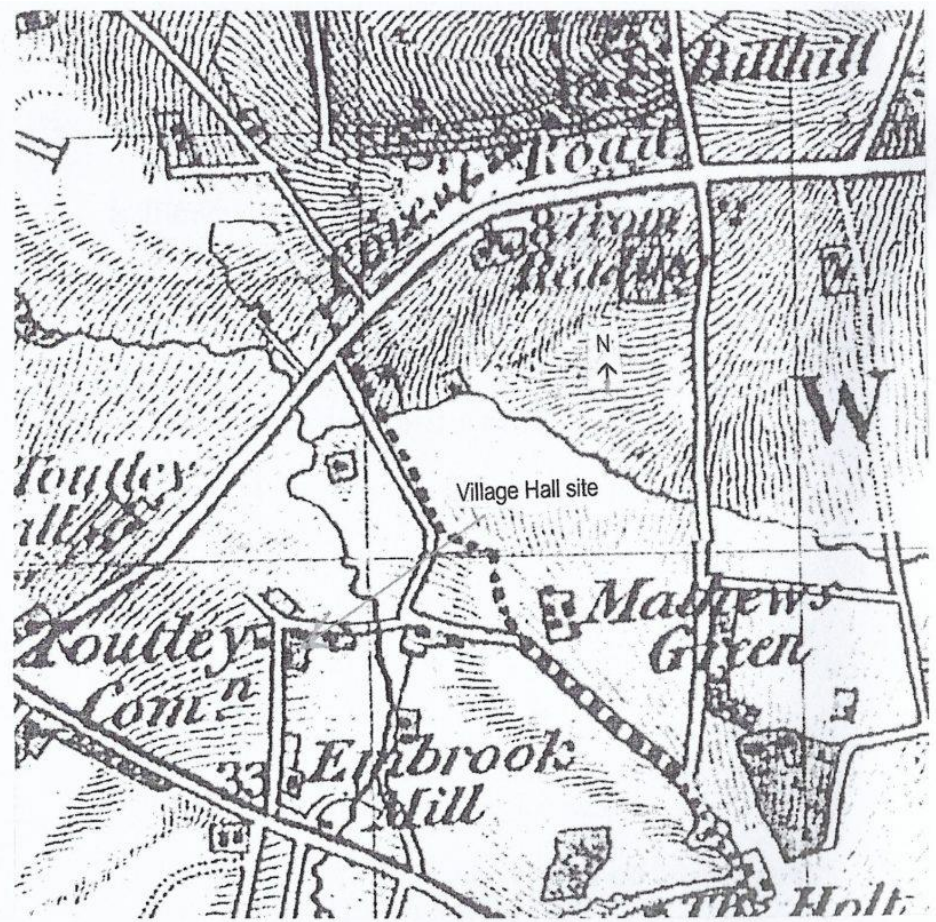

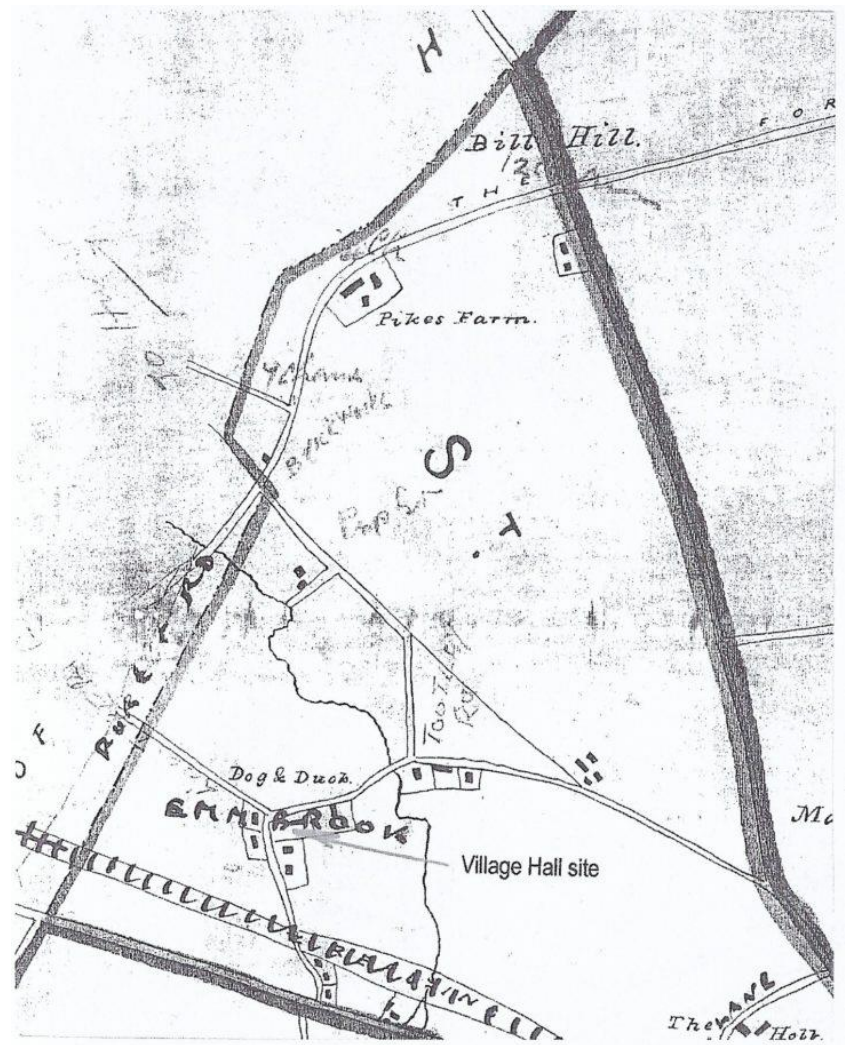

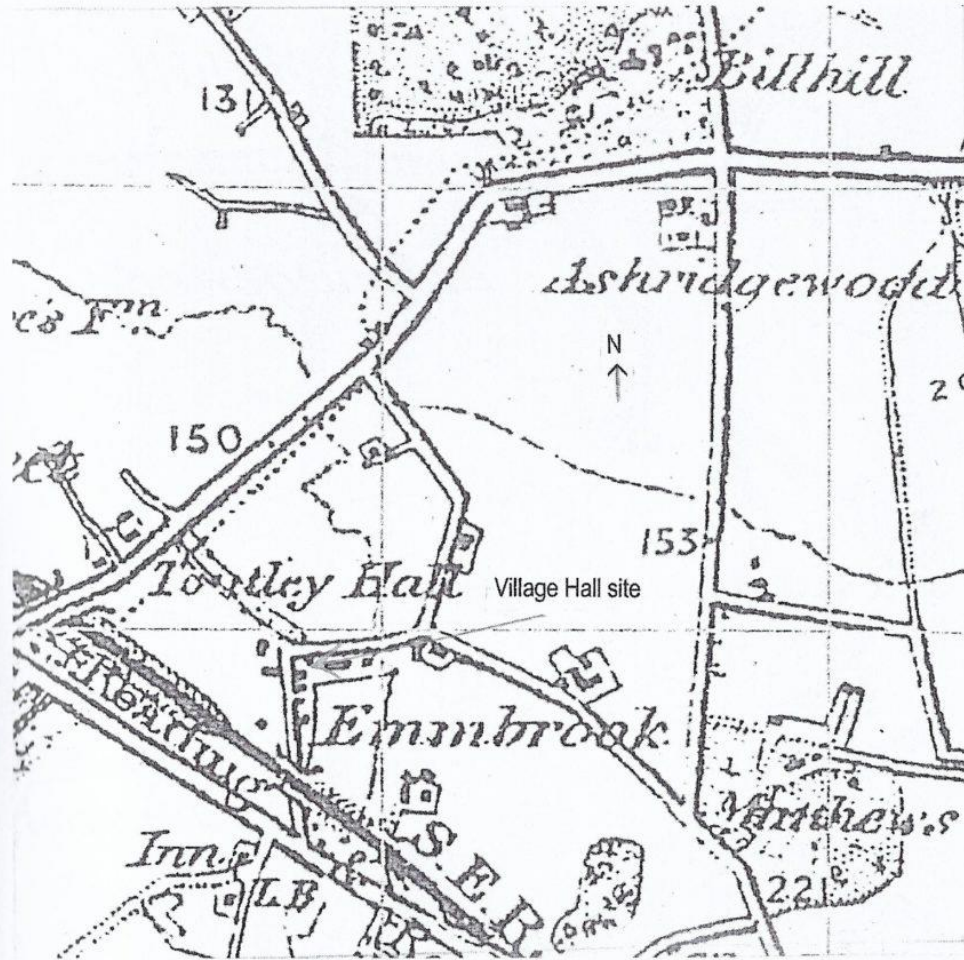


Map 1873 Emmbrook showing the School on the Village Hall site

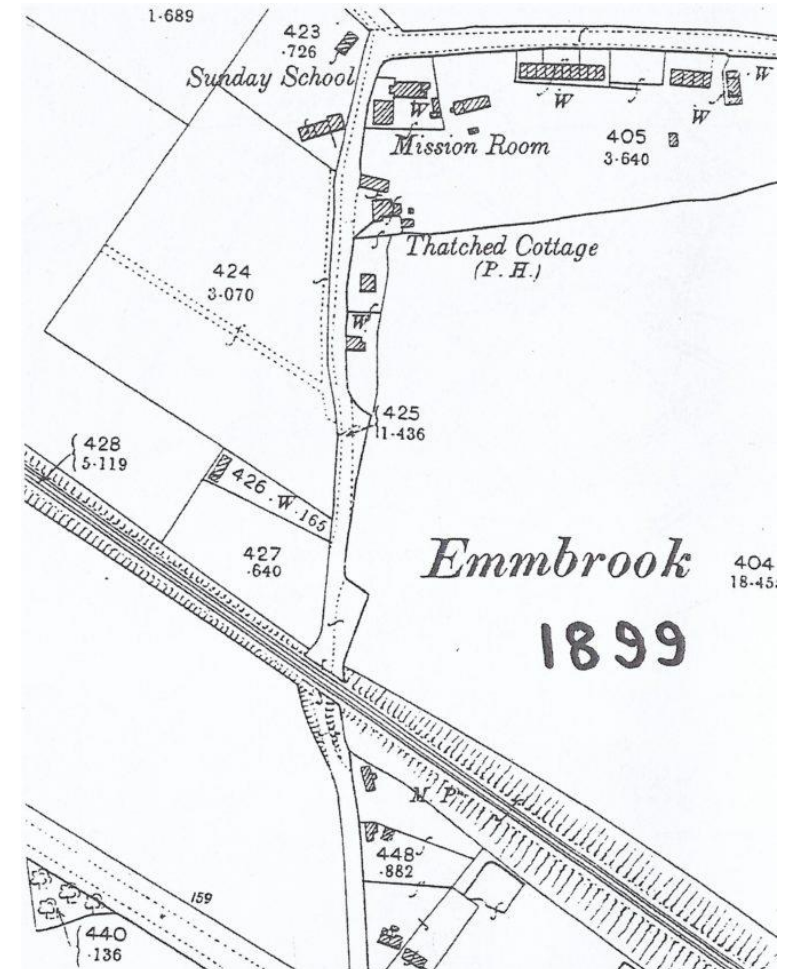


Map 1883 Emmbrook and its environs

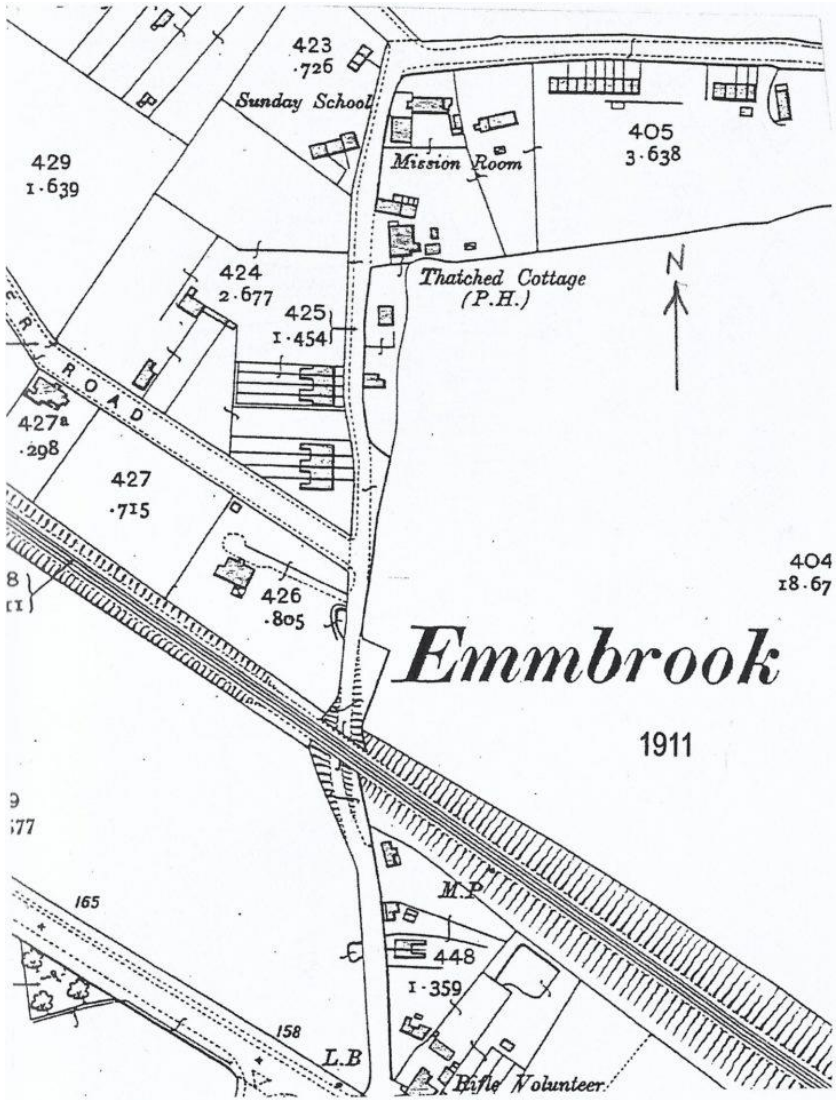


Map 1897 - 1909 showing the site of Emmbrook with the railway line built 1843 running through the south western part of the village

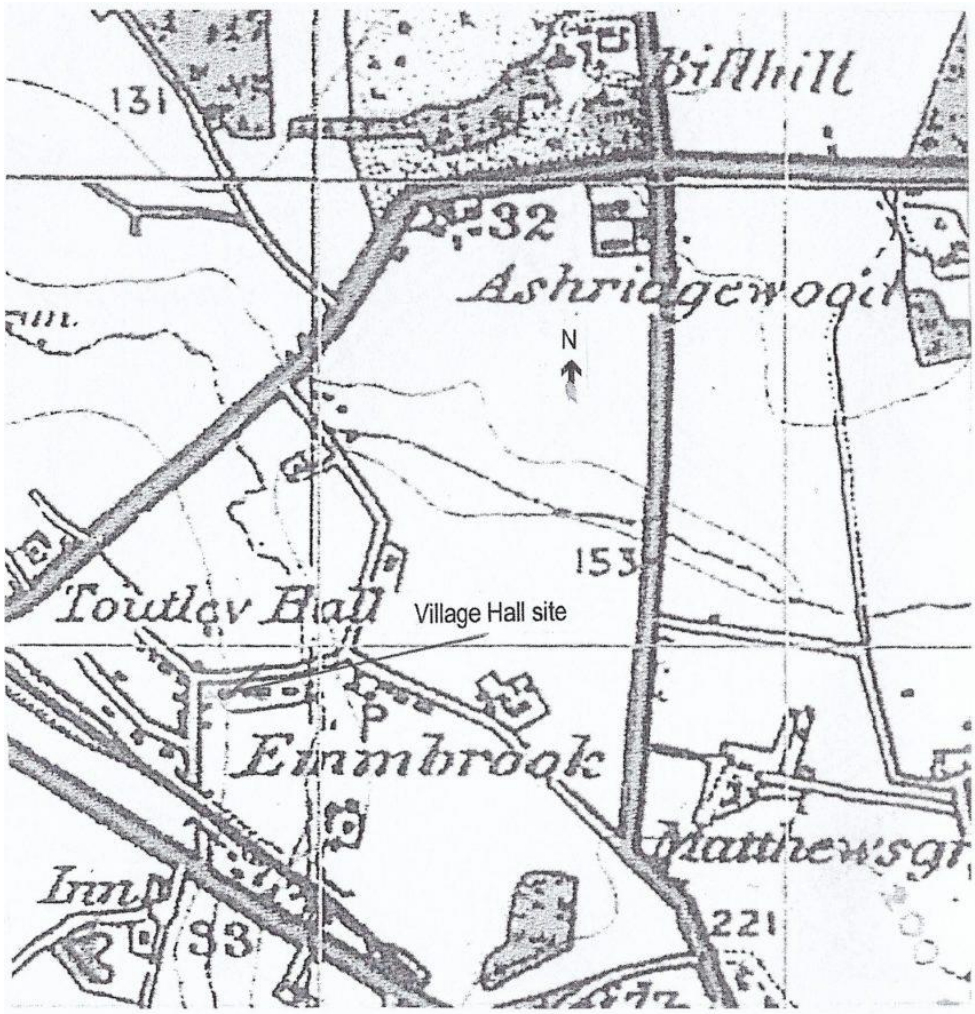


Map 1899 showing the Iron Room (Mission Room) to the south of the School Room, showing at the western side the porch for caps, coats and a lavatory built in 1892 (this was still in use in 1977). At the eastern end presumably the School House still lived in by Mr & Mrs BULLOCK. The outside buildings presumably contain the water closet. The well referred to in 1885 is not far away

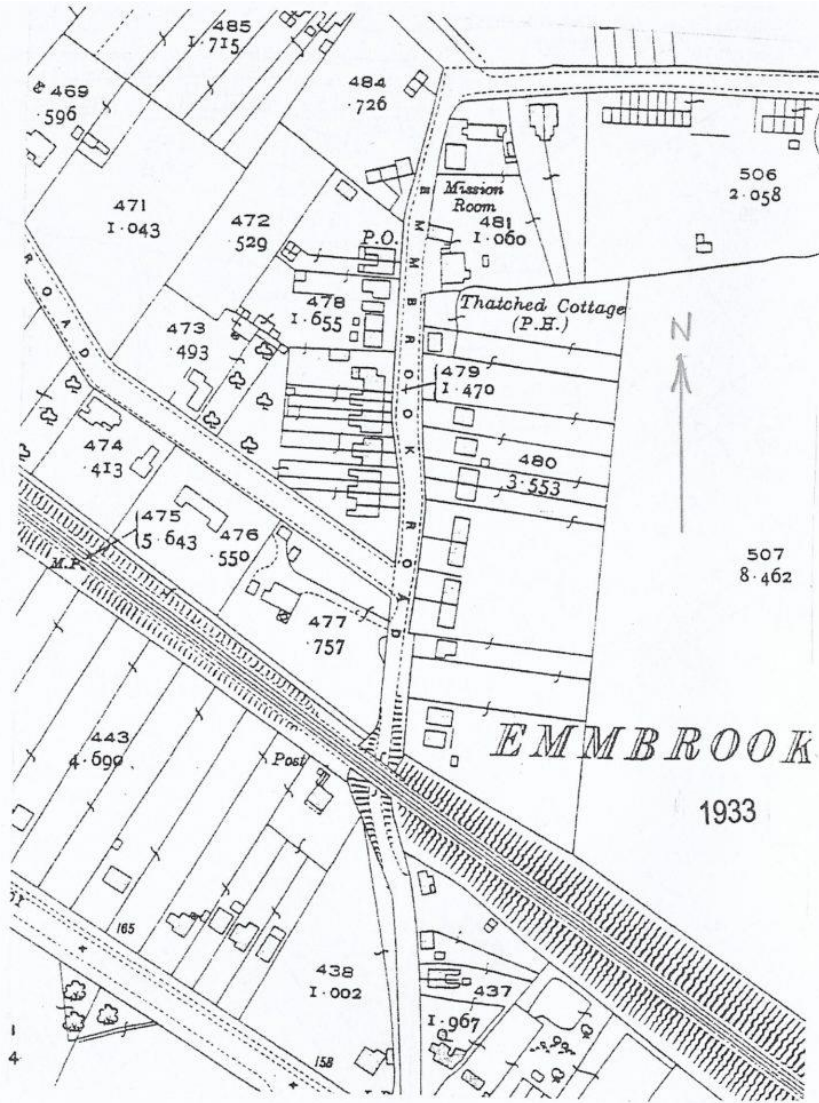


Map 1911 Emmbrook showing (as in Fig.7) the School Room as Sunday School

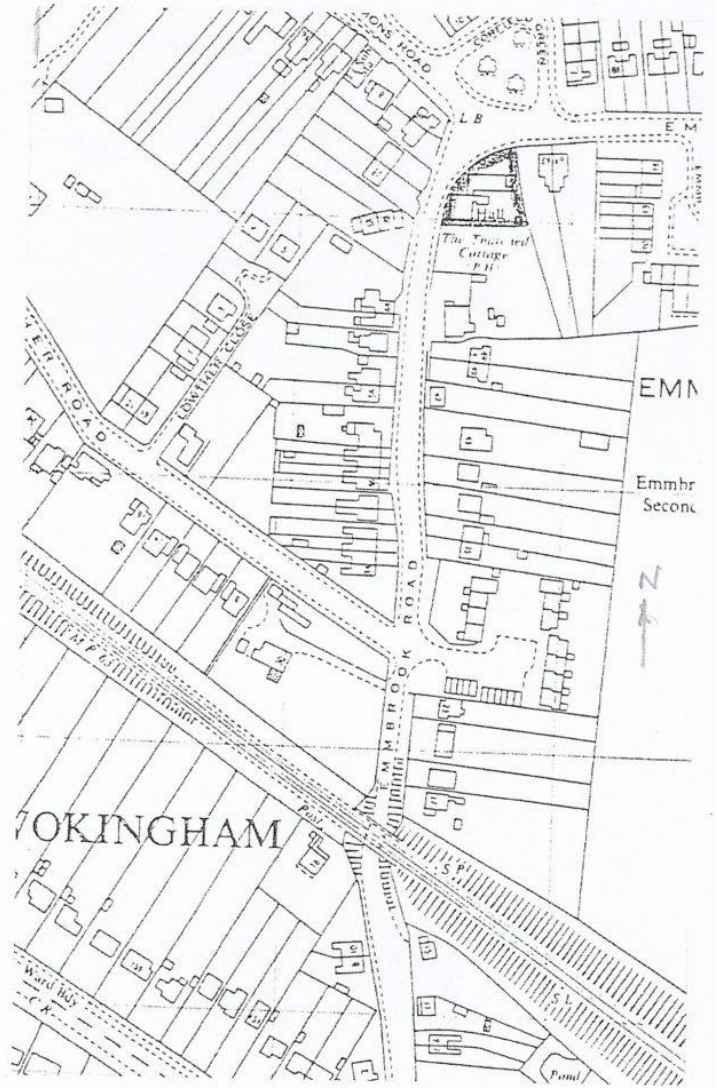


Map 1919 -1920 showing development of the village with the appearance of part of Lowther Road

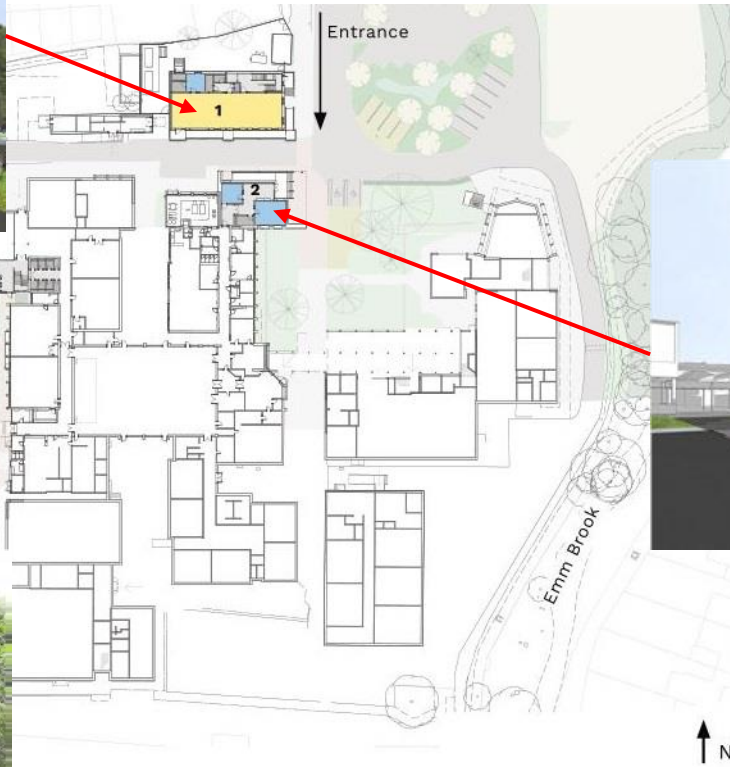




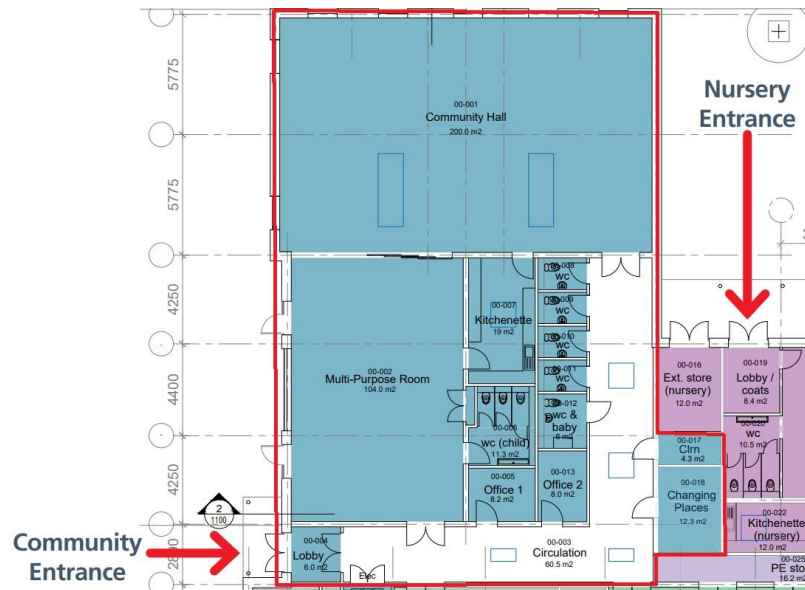

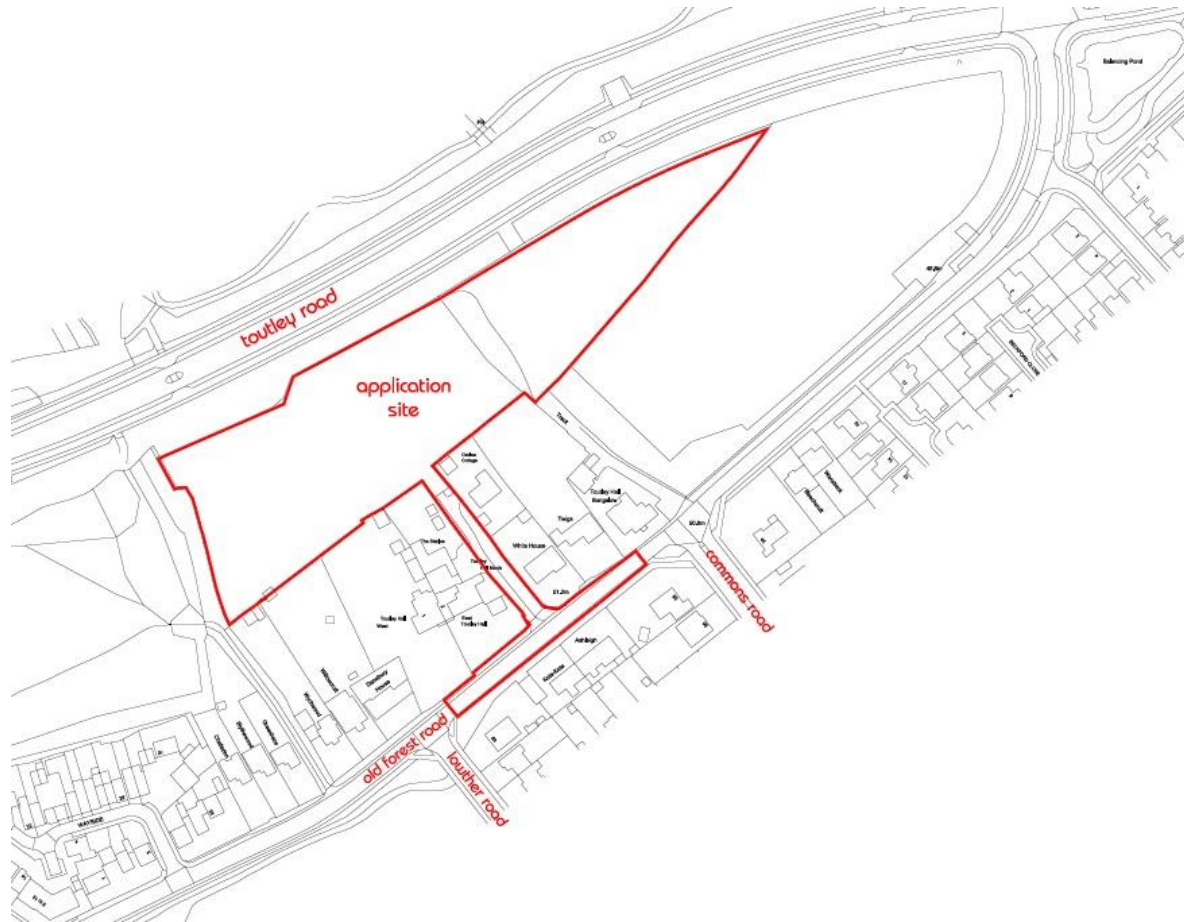
